Alaska	HB186	2010	Y	Weak	Yes	Exempts firearms, accessories, ammo mfg w/in the state. No lang RE prohibition for enforcing
Arizona	HB2111	2021	Y	Mid	Yes	Prohibits enforcement but w/o penalty for violation of prohibition
Arkansas	SB298	2021	Vetoed	Strong		Prohibited enforcement of federal regs. Offered a \$500 fine for violation of prohibition; misdemeanor charge for orders to violate. *Bill was vetoed by Gov and Senate overrode veto. House tabled then passed HB 1957
Arkansas	HB1957	2021	Y	Mid	Yes	Prohibition of enforcement w/o penalties for violation of the prohibition
Idaho	SB 1332	2014	Y	Strong	Yes	Provides LEOs from enforcing any fed law that violate 2A state laws. Offers civil and criminal penalties including fines and misdemeanor penalties. As adopted, Emergency Declarations override the prohibitions and no protection specifically from RFOs
Kansas	SB102	2013	Y	Mid	Yes	Stronger on prohibition as it declares the feds may not enforce (or attempt) and penalties include level 10 nonperson felony. Protections appear to apply to only firearms, access, ammo mfg IN STATE; however, does affirm that components imported and then attached to firearms owned in-state are not subject to exemption. No RFO language. No State of Emergency clause.

Missouri	HB85	2021	Y	Strong		One of the strongest SAPAs nationally and could be used as a template for all states. Includes civil and criminal penalties for violation of prohibiting enforcement of unconstitutional Fed Reg/Law. Does not declare exemption from emergency declarations nor address RFOs specifically. Fed RFOs, if passed and found constitutional would be enforceable.
Montana	HB0258	2021	Y	Weak	Yes	Simply prohibits/bans enforcement or the use of public funds to enforce federal reg/laws. No penalties for violation of the prohibition.
Nebraska	Proclamation	2021	Signed	Weak	Yes	Not codified. Fluff with sparkly stuff...
North Dakota	HB 1383 + Proclamation	2021	Y & signed	Weak	Yes	"may" rather than "shall not" language; no penalties for violation; declared an Emergency Measure. Proclamation is fluff and sparkly stuff
Oklahoma	SB 631	2021	Y	Weak	Yes	Preemption language. No penalties or relief.
South Carolina	H. 3094	2021	Y	Weak	Yes	Stuffed into an open carry bill; language provides for the carrying of concealable weapons specifically. Leaves long guns+ omitted and does not forbid enforcement of Fed Reg/Law; qualifiers enlisted. See: Section 23-31-250
Tennessee	SB 1335	2021	Y	Weak	Yes	Prohibits without penalty. Ambiguous language
Texas	HB 2622	2021	Y	Weak	Yes	"May" not "shall not" language; does not prohibit 'contracts' w/feds that would result in enforcement; provides for individual complaint to AG and provides political agencies representation if Feds take action.
Utah	SB 11	2010	Y	Weak	Yes	Relates more to mfg of firearms/access/ammo in the state. It's similar to the old TN Firearms Freedom Act 2009 which relates to firearm construction/components etc moreso than possessing/ownership by individuals.

West Virginia	HB 2694	2021	Y	Mid	Yes	The original version of the bill was stronger than any legislation in the nation. Based on the <i>Prinze v US</i> immigration case (CA), had Senator Trump not pushed his watered down version, would have set groundbreaking prohibition. However, the enrolled version omitted the penalties and instead created protections for LEOs to ignore orders to enforce fed reg/laws that the AG determines unconstitutional and may ignore such orders until the AG successfully argues the unconstitutionality.
Wyoming	HB 0095	2010	Y	Weak	Yes	Relates primarily to the mfg of firearms/access/ammo in state. Offers non-compliance of registry, etc enacted by Fed law.
